The Secretary to Government, Minorities Welfare Department welcomed the Chief Secretary, Nominated Members and Official Members to the Second State Level Committee for Prime Minister's New 15 Point Programme. Before the Agenda was taken up, the Chief Secretary

suggested to hear the views of the nominated members and then to take up the Agenda. Accordingly the nominated members were requested to express their views.

2. Shri Abdul Hakeem, a nominated member suggested to call regularly the State Level Committee and the District Level Committee meetings once in three months as stipulated. For which, the Chief Secretary assured to convene the State Level Committee meeting and also agreed to issue directions to the Deputy Commissioners to hold District Level Committee meetings regularly.

3. Shri A.A.Ganjanaver, a nominated member pointed out that many of the Departments were not taking action on the proceedings of the previous meetings in time and just a few days before the present meeting action has been taken and he cited the example of Home Department. He also brought to the notice that it was decided in the previous meeting to forward proposals to Government of India in cases of death occurred during communal riots at Mysore for payment of compensation of Rs.3 lakhs to the families of the deceased, but the Home Department has taken one year to issue a circular to the concerned officers.

4. Shri Kalegal Gaffar, a nominated member informed that no action has been taken to appoint Urdu knowing teachers in Anganwadis of Minority dominated areas. He also informed that in many Urdu schools teachers have not been appointed and the conditions of these schools is very bad and needs immediate repair

5. Shri Shimoga Muneer, a nominated member informed that under the Scholarship scheme of minority community the amount should reach in time and this will help the students to continue their education.

The hon'ble Member also suggested that the State Level Committee Members may be invited by the concerned D.C's to the District Level Committee meetings of Prime Minister's New 15 Points Programme.

6. Shri Gerald Fernandes, a nominated member raised many issues particularly non-utilisation of Sarve Shikshana Abhiyana funds allotted to the Urdu schools. He suggested that the Planning Department should indicate targets for minority in the budget and plans for all the schemes of the Government as resolved in the previous meeting. He also informed that innocent minority youths are arrested by the Police during communal disturbances and they are not released even though no charges could be established against them. He complained that due to lack of proper follow up action by the Police and the Prosecution Department the real culprits in communal clashes get released by the Courts and the innocents suffer due to delay in filing the charge sheet against them. He also complained that normally Peace Committee meetings are held only after the occurrence of communal disturbances, hence he suggested to direct the concerned officer to convene Peace Meetings regularly before any such occurrence of disturbances.
