Syed Zameer Pasha, IAS, Secretary, Minority Welfare Department welcomed the Chief Secretary, Principal Secretary Home Department, Principal Secretary DPAR, Lead Bank Manager Syndicate Bank, all other officers and non-official members present in the meeting and requested the Chairman and Chief Secretary to conduct the meeting.

Agenda No.2. Confirmation of the proceedings of the Prime Ministers' New 15 Point

Programme meeting held on 15/02/2011 and review of Action Taken Report:-

The Chief Secretary, requested the non-official members to make suggestions on the proceedings of the previous meeting held on 15/02/2011; as no modifications were proposed by official/non officials present and therefore, confirmed the proceedings of the last meeting.

Thereafter, Chief Secretary took up the review of the Action Taken Report of the previous meeting and asked the Secretary, minority welfare department to place the same before the meeting. The Action Taken Report was read and recorded with the following observations/suggestions/instructions.

1. Home Department:-

The DG and IGP informed the committee that the compensation from state/central governments is paid to the families of two victims during communal riots in Shimoga on 12/05/2010, and in case of the third victim Shri. Lakshman is yet to be paid as the documents have to be produced by the next of kin of the deceased. Chief Secretary instructed the DG and IGP to expedite the compensation to the said victim and send the report to the government.

2. Education Department:-

The committee took note of the explanation of the education department about the closure of Urdu primary/higher primary schools. The Chief Secretary, advised the education department to take up merger of such schools (whether urdu or other government schools) only

when there is nil enrolment and improve the enrolment in government run Minority institutions if the same is low.

The Chief Secretary and the members present expressed their displeasure over the details furnished by the department about the Sarva Shikshana Abhiyana (SSA) scheme as the Director, Urdu language and Linguistic minorities was unable to furnish the total figure of the funds received under the scheme, expenditure incurred and the allocation made by the department to minorities to the extent of 30% of the funds as per 2006 circular of the education department. The officer was asked to obtain the correct information and return before the committee along with the concerned officer.

After his return along with the Director, Sarva Shikshana Abhiyana (SSA) it was informed, to the committee that Rs.1458 crores was the total allocation and Rs. 244 crores was allotted to minorities, but were unable to give the expenditure. The Chief Secretary expressed his unhappiness over the details furnished by the education department and directed the Secretary, minority welfare department to convene a separate meeting and review the SSA Programme implementation for minorities and place the report in the next meeting.

Shri. Mohsin Member brought to the notice of the Chief Secretary that the rentals of Morarji Desai Residential schools for minorities school at Kadur is not paid to the landlord and that the department should pay the rentals in time to the landlords. Shri. Mubasheer, member requested the chief secretary to extend sports facilities to Minority institutions of the government and also provide for play grounds as many of the Minority institutions do not have the same. The chief secretary asked the education department to give all the facilities provided to other institutions in the state to Minority institutions also and regarding playground he advised that at all locations playgrounds cannot be provided however, wherever it is possible the education
